

## Survey of the Book of John

**Introduction:** The \*Book of John stands apart from the Synoptic Gospels for a couple of reasons: 1) there is no mention of the birth and early years of Jesus, 2) John says nothing about choosing the apostles, casting out demons, or the Judgment, and 3) a greater amount of attention is focused on Jesus' final instructions to the apostles.

Since John was written 30-35 years after the circulation of the Synoptic Gospels, there was no need to duplicate their contents. However, John's

purpose was clearly an attempt to supplement what had already been known about Jesus in an effort to produce faith (20.31). His is the simplest in terms of vocabulary and style yet it is, in some ways, the most profound of the four, in terms of the issues it raises. For these reasons, the Book of John is one of the more effective evangelistic "tools" of the New Testament. One reason is because it was written to a universal audience. Discuss why you think this book might be a good place to start when teaching others about Jesus.
